# EI and CPP Deduction Maximums Reset:

For those that have maxed out their CPP and EI deductions in 2025, I want to remind folks that CPP and EI will begin to be deducted from your paycheque starting again in January. This means that if you make at least as much as a Class 4 Step 5 full-time teacher, you may notice a significant reduction in your take-home pay between December 2025 and January 2026. Deduction <u>rates for CPP</u> remains at 5.95% of your salary and the <u>EI rate</u> is lowering to 1.63% of your salary (from 1.64%).
